BASIC DEVELOPMENT CO-OPERATION PROGRAM



B-1 Bilateral Development Assistance Program

B-1.1 Emergency humanitarian and food aid

The fight against poverty, diseases, illiteracy and hunger is currently the greatest moral, political and social issue. This goal becomes a major priority for the International Community, since such phenomena endanger security, development and prosperity of the world. Greece, within the framework of the “Millennium Goals” set in the Millennium Conference, participates at the overall effort for combating important global problems and the prevention of the dangers that these problems bear.



In this regard, humanitarian aid provided by Greece, in the form of emergency assistance, aims at swiftly confronting disasters resulting from emergency situations or natural phenomena. Greece seeks to provide assistance to all crises, independently to whether these are due to human or natural causes and is prompt to send emergency assistance to confront them. It rapidly mobilizes aid provision mechanisms in order to offer emergency relief aid, according to anticipated rules of international pleas and the affected country. Moreover, Greece forwards to the affected areas, special units to combat natural disasters, medical teams, squads to administrate camps and stretcher-bearers. Greece’s commitment to humanitarian assistance was marked, in the case of its imminent and effective assistance provision to the countries of South-East Asia after the disastrous earthquake and the tsunami and led Kofi Annan to praise Greece as a “Global Strength of Compassion”.

Furthermore, beyond the provision of emergency assistance, Greece aims at confronting crises that arise from consolidated problems of the developing world, the so called “long term” crises. These refer to basic day to day needs and aim at improving quality of life. In this framework, Greece provides humanitarian, medical, pharmaceutical and food aid, while significant activities are implemented to prevent and combat HIV/AIDS, Tuberculosis, Malaria and other pandemics that deplore populations in many developing countries. To this end, HELLENIC AID co-operates either with International Organizations such as, WFP, UNAIDS, UNDP, UNICEF, FAO, or with Greek NGOs that act in the field, autonomously or in the framework of their international networks.

Greek response towards populations suffering from humanitarian disasters does not merely end to the provision of emergency aid for imminent relief. It proceeds to the second phase, that of reconstruction and rehabilitation. During this phase Greece implements activities that aim at restoring the “status quo”, mainly as regards medical care and education, by financing

programs for rehabilitation of school buildings, equipping of schools, establishment of health centers, reconstruction of road networks etc. that are implemented in the form of international development co-operation programs.



As far as co-operation with International Organisations is concerned, Greece allocated in 2006 the amount of 2.70 MEURO to WFP for food aid to various countries, especially in Africa and the Caucasus, while the amount of 1.00 MEURO was approved to be granted to FAO for food security programs. Moreover, the amount of 0.60 MEURO was subscribed to UNAIDS to finance programs combating HIV/AIDS in African countries.

Furthermore, other programs were implemented via Greek NGOs (Doctors of the World, Doctors of Heart), in the following countries:

- Ethiopia, two programs were implemented by Greek NGOs amounting to more than 0.20 MEURO, for the provision of food aid and the establishment of a model medical center to combat malaria.
- Ivory Coast, two programs were implemented by Greek NGOs, amounting to 0.12 MEURO, for the provision of medicines to refugee camps and food to the orphanage "HELLAS" (Greek Action in Africa).



- Zimbabwe, beyond the amount of 0.05 MEURO (part of the 2.70 MEURO granted to the WFP), a program was implemented by a Greek NGO amounting to 0.05 MEURO, for the provision of medical care and treatment to patients suffering from HIV/AIDS (Doctors Without Borders).
- Kenya, programs of emergency humanitarian and food aid were financed amounting to 0.15 MEURO (Action Aid, Doctors of Heart)
- Congo Democratic Republic, apart from the amount of 0.10 MEURO (part of the 2.70 MEURO granted to the WFP) and 0.60 MEURO granted to FAO for food aid provision, a Greek NGO is active in the region (Functionaries of Love for Health) financed by the Ministry of Foreign Affairs with the amount of 0.102 MEURO.
- Malawi, a Greek NGO (Doctors Without Borders) is financed by the Ministry of Foreign Affairs with the amount of 0.10 MEURO, in order to implement a program for the provision of medical care and treatment to patients suffering from HIV/AIDS

- Niger, a country that continued to suffer from famine in 2006, was granted by Greece food aid via the WFP amounting to 0.70 MEURO. Another 0.085 MEURO were granted via a Greek NGO (One Earth).
- South Africa, was granted the amount of 0.03 MEURO via UNICEF, for the children suffering from HIV/AIDS.
- Swaziland, was also granted the amount of 0.03 MEURO via UNICEF, for the children suffering from HIV/AIDS.
- Sudan, in order to combat the Darfur crisis, Greece disbursed the amount of 0.20 MEURO via the WFP (part of the 2.70 MEURO granted to the WFP) plus the amount of 0.205 MEURO for programs implemented by Greek NGOs (Doctors of the World, One Earth, Doctors of Heart, March MAKE).

Furthermore, Greece granted the following sums of money:

- 0.125 MEURO, via the WFP, to countries located at the horn of Africa,
- 0.05 MEURO, via UNHCR for repatriation of refugees from Liberia,
- 0.05 MEURO, via UNHCR for the refugees from Burundi, who were provided also with food aid amounting to 0.04 MEURO via a Greek NGO,
- 0.05 MEURO bilaterally to Zambia, for purchasing antiretroic medicines to combat HIV/AIDS.

The amount granted to the WFP was also disbursed for programs in Somalia, Tanzania, Djibouti, Central African Republic and Eritrea.

As far as the East European countries and countries of the Caucasus region are concerned, Greece offered the amount of 0.20 MEURO to Georgia and 0.30 MEURO to Armenia via the WFP (part of the 2.70 MEURO granted to the WFP).



Moreover, significant humanitarian aid was provided to countries in the Middle East, especially after the humanitarian crisis of July – August 2006 that struck Lebanon. Eight air aid delivery missions were executed to Larnaka. This aid was further shipped to Beirut. Its total cost reached some 2.30 MEURO, while it rises to 2.50 MEURO if disbursements of Greek Municipalities are included. This amount includes Greek subscriptions to special UN Organisations (0.12 MEURO to IOM, 0.014 MEURO to UNHCR and 0.14 MEURO to WFP).

Greek humanitarian aid to the Palestinian Administration in 2006 amounted to 0.20 MEURO via the aid provision Tentative International Mechanism (TIM). Another 0.10 MEURO were granted via WFP (part of the 2.70 MEURO granted to the WFP), while more than 0.20 MEURO were granted via programs of Greek NGOs for the provision of medicines and food. Finally, in Syria, an NGO program amounting to 0.10 MEURO for the provision of medical services to the inhabitants of North Syria (Hellenic Red Cross, IOCC, Doctors of the World) is in progress.

In regard to the countries of Asia, after the unprecedented response of Greece for assistance provision to the Tsunami affected countries of South-Eastern Asia, our Country paid, during 2006, the amount of 0.394 MEURO for the continuation of a food aid program for schools in

Sri Lanka. Moreover, the amount of 0.30 MEURO was bilaterally paid to Philippines, in the form of humanitarian aid to the flood and landslide victims.

B-1.2 Development assistance

Development Programs

Development programs are based on the MDGs, their main target being to eradicate poverty in developing countries, to raise living standards and improve local development potential.

Implemented programs fulfill the following basic standards:

- effectively meet the basic needs for economic and social development of populations in developing countries, particularly of the poorest social classes and vulnerable groups, such as children and women
- improve living standards of target groups and simultaneously enhance capabilities of local populations to promote development by their own means and increase their incomes
- take due note of development priorities and goals set by governments and decentralized administrative authorities of developing countries and countries with economies in transition, within the framework of “a partnership relation”
- promote local capacity building from the development benefits that evolve from the implementation of programs
- contribute to the reconstruction of developing countries

Indicatively, as examples of good practice, hereunder are referred some of the principal development assistance programs that were implemented by various Bodies (Ministries, Legal Entities, NGOs) during 2006:

Ministry of the Interior, Public Administration and Decentralization

Series of activities in the Province of Comrat, region of Gagauzia - Moldova

1. Supply and equipping of an ambulance and a regaining consciousness system.
2. Supply and equipping of a refuse collection vehicle and bins.
3. Supply and installation of autonomous heating systems for Medical Centers.
4. Supply and installation of autonomous heating systems for Day Nurseries.
5. Classroom equipping for the state educational College “Michael Tsakir”.
6. Classroom equipping for the state University of Comrat.

All the abovementioned projects have been implemented in the Gagauzia region. This region is located at the Southern part of the Republic of Moldova. It enjoys its own Government and Administrative Autonomy, with a special legal framework, which makes it different from the rest of the Republic of Moldova, having its own budget and the possibility of independent economic management.



The Republic of Moldova is characterized as the poorest one in Europe, while the Gagauzia region has one of the lowest development levels in the entire country. Urban development infrastructures are at zero level, while there are huge development gaps between urban centers and the countryside. The Government tries to prioritize needs and elaborate certain draft plans of regional development, but lack of resources does not allow their implementation.

The above mentioned reasons contributed to the implementation of projects, by YPESDDA, orientated to cover social needs. In particular, the projects that were implemented addressed the sensitive sectors of health and education. Regarding the health sector, upgrading of the level of the provided health services was achieved with projects Nos. (1) and (3). Regarding the education sector, project No. (4) was chosen by taking into consideration the intensive need for social care and support of families in local communities, which raise their children without the presence of the mothers, who have immigrated in order to work abroad. Thus, the project contributed to the improvement of Nurseries' operation by upgrading accommodation conditions for children. Projects Nos. (5) and (6) contributed to the upgrading of University premises and to the provision of higher education with modern teaching means.



In terms of social infrastructure, Project No. (2) is also referred to, since its implementation aimed at improving public health infrastructures, protecting the environment and rising living standards.

All projects were handed over to the local Authorities during official ceremonies with full coverage by the local media, which broadcasted events in afternoon and evening news bulletins. In the same time, they broadcasted interviews of local Bodies which expressed their gratitude to the Greek Government. The reception committee noted the full project compliance, qualitative and quantitative, with the requirements of the program contracts and the award contracts with the ad-hoc project contractors. The representatives of the local Bodies assured the members of the reception committee that all delivered projects and equipment were of high quality and fully covered their needs.

Education – Social Exclusion – Sexual Exploitation – Immigration

The program was implemented by the General Secretariat on Gender Equality of YPESDDA and the supervised Research Center for Gender Equality (KETHI), in collaboration with the Hellenic Planned Parenthood Association – member of the IPPF.

According to the Action Plan, the Program aimed at providing assistance to the socially excluded groups of women (sexual exploitation victims, immigrants), with the support of the Planned Parenthood Associations of the beneficiary countries (or of the relevant NGOs dealing with such issues) in order to improve their services and to provide better counseling, especially to the following thematic sectors:

- Awareness raising regarding human rights, gender-stereotype issues, and provision of information on the problem of poverty, immigration (relating to the sexual exploitation),
- Counseling and guidance on Sexual and Reproductive Health and Rights (e.g. information and training on sexually transmitted infections and diseases, etc.),
- Vocational orientation and counseling: Vocational re-orientation, prospects and incentives for women entrepreneurship.

The program was implemented in three stages:

- Stage 1: A pilot program – “Training of trainers” Workshop,
- Stage 2: Interstate Meetings in the recipient countries,
- Stage 3: Information campaigns in the recipient countries that took place during the implementation of the program.



Applicant Body: General Secretariat on Gender Equality - YPESDDA

Interstate Partners: Corporations – Members of the International Planned Parenthood Federation (IPPF): Albania, Georgia, Moldova and Ukraine.

National Partners: Hellenic Planned Parenthood Association – IPPF and NGOs.

Budget: 0.15 MEURO.

Results:

- co-operation with International and European Organizations (NGOs), Networks active in the sectors of the program,
- training seminars and support via printed information material – brochures and posters, operate within the framework of communication policy, as forms of prevention, as well as enforcement of women in their effort to integrate and enroll in the labor market and in the social network,
- training of trainers program contributes to the enhancement and investment in human resources, within the framework of Lifelong Training,
- interstate approach plays a significant role through the active participation of NGOs and government partners, who participate in the program in the abovementioned countries with positive results,
- multiple benefits of the program focus on the transfer of know-how, provision of information, networking and data collection for further research.

Ministry of Foreign Affairs

The Greek - Bosnia & Herzegovina Friendship Building in Sarajevo (ESOAB) – Bosnia-Herzegovina

Reconstruction-refurbishment of the Government Building 3 (of the Common Institutions) in the center of Sarajevo, of a total budget of 16.79 MEURO, has been approved and is being implemented.

The aforesaid official co-financing proposal was integrated in the Bilateral Development Co-operation Program of Greece with Bosnia & Herzegovina, following a relevant positive

recommendation of the ESOAB Monitoring Committee. (5th Convergence – Thessaloniki 31-1-2003). This building, following a proposition from the Greek side, was renamed to “Greek - Bosnia & Herzegovina Friendship Building”.

The duration of the project is about 30 months from the commencement of the construction. The building is going to be handed over in June 2007.

The ESOAB financial contribution for the project was set to 13,497,073 EURO (80.39%), whereas the Bosnian participation will cover the difference (19.61%) which corresponds to the amount of 3,292,916 EURO.



To date some 10,797,977.87 EURO have been disbursed via the ESOAB to the Bosnian side, representing 80% of the Greek contribution to the project. The balance amounting to 2,699,096.13 EURO is available at the Bank of Greece through the PDE (Public Investment Program) of the Ministry of Economy and Finance and will be disbursed after the project's completion, as provided by the Bilateral Agreement.

This 20-floor building at the center of Sarajevo is going to accommodate the Government of Bosnia & Herzegovina and the offices of the Regional Co-operation Council, the new Organization of South-Eastern Europe.

Construction of a Medical Center at the town of Homs - Syria

Construction of a reinforced concrete building having a total surface/area of 700m², on a piece of land provided by the Municipality of Homs. The town of Homs is located at an industrial region of Syria with a low per capita income, which experiences serious economic problems. The educational level is particularly low and the unemployment rate high. Serious health problems are obvious among the children population.



The construction of the Medical and Diagnostic Center was carried out based on a static study, within the framework of the laws and building regulations of Syria. It consists of an elevated ground-floor covering an area of approximately 350m² which will be used as a patient reception desk, a first aid infirmary, four infirmary-examination rooms and a

dispensary. Moreover, there will be a semi-underground floor of about 350m². It has been constructed in such an architectural style, so as to resemble the Greek classical architectural style and thus to stand in the mind of the visitor or the passer by, as an image of Greece.

Architectural static, geotechnical, mechanical and implementation studies have been drawn up for the building's construction, as well the following construction works:



- Excavations, earthworks and landform works;
- Construction of building static elements (carrying body of reinforced concrete, as well as insulation of the elements);
- Completion of the construction work of the building (masonry, coatings, floors, peripheral insulation of the building and roof insulation works);
- Completion of the building's technical work (electrical, hydraulic and heating installations, false ceilings);
- Fitting of the building's equipment (frames, fences, sanitary facilities);
- Completion of the building's ornamental work (painting, configuration of the surrounding area and waste collection).

The direct beneficiaries of this project are all inhabitants of the town of Homs, 20% of which live below the poverty limit, whereas 70% live with less than 100 USD per month. The project contributes also to the improvement of the quality of the provided health care.



The program was implemented by the NGO "Development Co-operation & Solidarity", while its cost reached 0.36 MEURO, of which HELLENIC AID financial contribution rose to 0.27 MEURO.

Partial restoration of the irrigation canal "Thomas Filipeos" - Albania

The irrigation canal "Thomas Filipeos" was constructed in 1968, its length is 34 kilometers and crosses four provinces of South Albania:

- Messopotamos,
- Divris,
- Alikos and
- Livadia

of the Prefectures of Delvinos and Sarande. The waters of the Bistrissa River are channeled through the canal to the Vurkos plain, which constitutes an important source of primary development.



The plain region is considered one of the most fertile ones, but it is the least exploited. It is noted that since 1990 till nowadays, the irrigation canal was functioning deficiently and therefore, only 25% of the total surface of the cultivable land was irrigated.



Some 11 kilometers of the irrigation canal were repaired with the financing of HELLENIC AID. A three meters width and eleven kilometers in length road was constructed along the canal. The canal was also partially coated with reinforced concrete grid.

Two tunnels of 95 and 120 meters width, respectively, were constructed at the Livyna and Krania hill, while seventeen water flow controllers were constructed and installed and two bridges were restored having a total length of 480 meters.



The canal's restoration constitutes the most significant intervention for the development of agriculture and livestock farming in the region. The direct beneficiaries are twenty two villages, 80% of the inhabitants of which are farmers and animal breeders. The project was handed over on 27-6-2006, to the Sub-Prefect of Messopotamos, who guarantees its sustainability.

The program was implemented by the NGO “Humanitarian and Development Co-operation”, while its cost reached 0.60 MEURO, of which 0.45 MEURO were granted by HELLENIC AID.

Structural repairs in Schools and Boarding Schools in West Georgia and in the region of T’bilisi - Georgia

The program includes repair of Schools in West Georgia and in the region of T’bilisi, whose premises were deemed dangerous.

Indicatively referred, in the province of Samagrello, the 11th School of the town of Poti and the School of the Bia village of the Khobi district and in the province of Guria, the School of the Meria village of the district of Ozurgeto.

During the implementation of the program the following restoration works were carried out:



- Structural repairs on roofs, walls and floors,
- Replacement of windows and external doors,
- Repair of sanitary facilities, plumbing and electricity networks, equipment and piping replacement,
- Repair or replacement of radiators that substitute the central heating which was for a long time out of service,
- Repair of classrooms (ruined walls, floors, ceilings),
- Repair or replacement of furniture in classrooms,
- Aesthetical interventions (plastering, painting, fitting of floor tiles).



The program aims to contribute to the achievement of the Millennium Development Goals and create a safe environment for pupils attending these Schools. This program reduces the hazardous conditions of the school buildings and provides for basic comfort conditions.

About 1,224 pupils, 102 teachers and the school personnel are the direct beneficiaries. They derive great benefits from the program, since before the repairs, most of the parents did not allow their children to attend classes in the Schools, in order to avoid the risk of falling sick,

due to, on the one hand freezing conditions in the humid classrooms where the windows were broken and on the other poor sanitary conditions.



The Schools belong to the Ministry of Education and Agricultural Science and are administered by appointed school headmasters, teachers and school personnel. The repair works made in the aforesaid, are part of the schools' infrastructure and therefore belong to the Ministry of Education and Agricultural Science.

The program was implemented by the NGO "International Orthodox Christian Charities" (IOCC), while its cost reached 0.13 MEURO, of which 0.10 MEURO were granted by HELLENIC AID.

Construction and equipping of a Pre-school Nursery in the Farafra oasis - Egypt

The program's purpose is to provide assistance to working women of the Farafra oasis region, in Egypt.

The Farafra - New Valley region is an oasis in the famous Sahara white desert, where the inhabitants are in their majority farmers and work mainly as land cultivators and livestock breeders. Due to low family incomes and difficulties faced by the region, both parents have to work in most of the families.



In order to cover the region's needs, a Pre-school Nursery was constructed on a piece of land covering an area of 500m² that was donated by the Municipality of Farafra. This is a ground-floor reinforced concrete building, with modern facilities and appearance, which is appealing to children.

Its surface covers 142m² and it is composed of two classrooms of 30m² and 35m² respectively, an entrance of 12m², a reception of 20m² and 5 WC with their pre-halls. The façade of the Pre-school Nursery, as well as the entrance, have elements of Ionic style to remind of Greece.



The Pre-school Nursery was fully equipped with the necessary furniture.

Beneficiary population groups:

- The population of the region of the Farafra oasis and in particular the working mothers who will be able to leave their young children to the Pre-school Nursery;
- The young children who will be occupied productively;
- The workers and the technicians who worked on the construction, since this provided them an income;
- The personnel that will be employed (job creation) during the Pre-school Nursery's operation.



The program was implemented by the NGO “Humanitarian and Eurocultural Development and Co-operation – HEDA GREECE” while its cost reached 0.07 MEURO, of which 0.05 MEURO were granted by HELLENIC AID.

Actions against illegal human trafficking

HELLENIC AID is one of the main donors of the third stage of the TACT program (Transnational Actions against Child Trafficking) that is implemented in fifteen regions of Albania and includes coordinated international actions against child trafficking (prevention, protection, repatriation, re-integration, co-ordination).



HELLENIC AID supports the operation of the ARSIS Office in Tirana for the implementation of additional actions against illegal human trafficking, such as summer activities for street children conducted in the Rinia Park in Tirana, actions in the streets, implemented by ARSIS

and Terre des Hommes in Tirana, as well as psycho-social assistance for the detected children at national and transnational (Albania - Greece) level.

HELLENIC AID financed the humanitarian aid mission for sensitive social groups in Albania, as well as the construction of the “Luludhja t’kne” Nursery for the Roma of the Korce region, a community particularly vulnerable to illegal children trafficking.

Ministry of National Defense

Provision of healthcare to Afghan Nationals – Afghanistan

In January 2002, the Government Council on Foreign Affairs and Defense (KYSEA) approved the deployment of Hellenic Forces in Afghanistan and particularly, in the region of Kabul and its suburbs, based on the Bonn Agreement (5-12-2001) and Resolution No. 1510 of the United Nations Security Council.

The objective of the mission of the Hellenic Force in Afghanistan is:

- To assist efforts of the Afghan Government for the country’s reconstruction and rehabilitation, by providing humanitarian assistance, performing various works and providing public utility assistance;
- The participation of Greece at the execution of Resolutions taken by the UN Security Council.



In August 2005, after a period of intensive preparation and organization, the 299 Mobile Campaign Surgical Hospital (Field Hospital) (KIHNE) was set in operation, within the framework of the peacekeeping mission of ISAF. This is a Medical-nursing Unit of 30 beds and 49-officers staff, located at the Kabul International Airport (KAIA) and operates as a hospital and a reception center for the injured people taken there, providing health support and care to Afghan citizens. Therefore, its social contribution is significant.



Since the initiation of its operation, the 299 KIHNE has, inter alia, carried out the following activities: 1,755 examinations of Afghans, 1,674 microbiological examinations, 938

radiological (X-ray) tests, 239 ultrasonographies, 335 surgical examinations, 69 surgical operations, 651 hospitalizations, 62 medical evacuations.

Recently, the 299 KIHNE organized the training of qualified Afghan doctors working in civil hospitals, which will be repeated in the future as well.

Provision of health care to the population of Gjirokaster – Albania

The construction and operation of the Gjirokaster Hospital is also included in the humanitarian work of the Hellenic Armed Forces.



This Hospital was constructed, equipped, staffed and is operating under the auspices of the Greek Ministry of National Defense. It provides high quality health and nursing services, to the advantage of the region's Albanian citizens. During its operation, its main goal is provision of healthcare, as well as training of the Albanian personnel, in order to ensure its normal operation after its handing over to the Albanian Authorities. The agreement on its operation by Greek doctors is until July 2007, with the possibility of extending this date.



From commencement of its operation, until nowadays, the region's citizens "embraced" it trustfully. This Hospital is served by three specializing doctors (pathologist, surgeon and anesthesiologist) and two non-specializing doctors from the Greek side and two specializing pathologists retrained in cardiology and ultrasounds. The Hospital's outpatients departments have been visited by 3,003 patients over the last period, some 23,268 persons have had microbiological examinations, 1,630 patients visited the X-ray department, 21 patients had surgical operations, 213 patients cardiologic ultrasounds, while 543 patients were hospitalized.

Ministry of the Environment Land Planning and Public Works

Mediterranean Component of the European Water Initiative (MED EUWI).

Since WSSD, the Greek Government (Hellenic Ministry for the Environment, Physical Planning and Public Works – MoE - and Hellenic Ministry of Foreign Affairs, with the support of a Secretariat undertaken by 'Global Water Partnership-Mediterranean / GWP-Med') has

undertaken the responsibility of leading the Mediterranean Component of the EU's Initiative 'Water for Life' (MED EUWI).

The MED EUWI represents a strategic partnership to assist national efforts and strategies of the Mediterranean partner countries (N.Africa, East Mediterranean, SE Europe) to achieve their commitments under the Millennium Development Goals (MDGs) and Johannesburg targets on water supply and sanitation (WSS) and on integrated water resources management (IWRM) by 2015.



The MED EUWI constitutes a co-operation platform, open to all the partners who are active in water resources management, in the Mediterranean region. This geographical area is particularly sensitive both in political and ecological-environmental terms. The Mediterranean countries share also many cross-border waters, a fact that renders the cooperation between them even more important and imperative, whereas they directly neighbor with the enlarged EU. For these reasons, co-operation among these countries and the rest of the social partners within the MED EUWI framework, can thus significantly contribute to poverty eradication, enhancement of livelihoods and sustainable economic development, providing a catalyst for peace and security in the region.

The basic goal of the MED EUWI is the planning of improved and targeted projects and interventions that will cover actual priority needs in the recipient countries, in the sectors of irrigation, sewage and integrated water resources management, upon requests by the countries themselves. The initiative aims also at improving co-ordination between relevant programs and financial frameworks in order to avoid overlappings and provide a more effective usage of the available resources from various sources.

Within this framework, the development of synergies and the prominence of complementarity between the MED EUWI and other Initiatives is systematically promoted. For example, the MED EUWI is going to constitute the main pillar for water resources issues, particularly in the sector of protection from pollution of the Mediterranean by industrial waste waters and urban waste waters, as well as for the new Initiative of the European Committee under the title "Horizon 2020" that aims at the de-pollution of the Mediterranean by 2020. The MED EUWI is also closely connected with the new "European Neighborhood and Partnership Instrument" (ENPI, 2007-2013) to identify priority activities in Mediterranean countries for funding during 2007-2013 by the European Committee. Furthermore, co-ordination and co-operation is also sought between the MED EUWI and the GEF financial framework for the Mediterranean (GEF Strategic Partnership for the Mediterranean 2007-2012).

Due to the systematic political and economic support of YPEHODE, the MED EUWI has been broadly acknowledged, as one of the most important "strategic frameworks" in the sector of water resources in the Mediterranean, assuring at the same time potential, know-how and Greece's willingness for action.

Effective co-ordination of donors, at recipient country level, is a basic instrument for the achievement of the MED EUWI goals. This co-ordination is systematically promoted through the elaboration of annual action plans for all MED EUWI partner-countries, for the realization of which the joint agreement of all donors activated in each country is sought.

The elaboration of a series of actions under the general title “Country Dialogues on Water in Mediterranean countries” also contributes to the effective co-ordination of donors. Country Dialogues are already being elaborated in two Mediterranean countries (Lebanon, Egypt), while the initiation of Dialogues in other two-three countries of the region is promoted during the two-year period 2007-2008.



The elaboration of the Country Dialogues leads to recording and prioritization of the required interventions that will have to be implemented in recipient countries, as well as to determination of a mutually agreed Time schedule, among the main national social partners, for the achievement of the goals set by the international community as regards water. It is noted that the elaboration of Country Dialogues is a high priority for the European Committee as well, due to the fact that it is expected that, through this procedure critical thematic fields for the orientation of financing towards Mediterranean countries for the period 2007-2013, will be brought out. Elaboration of Country Dialogues is also a direct contribution to the realization of the “Framework for Common Action Around Shared Goals” adopted during the EPOC/DAC Joint Ministerial Meeting in April 2006. Particularly, as regards the elaboration of the Country Dialogue of Egypt, Greece/YPEHODE is in close co-operation with the EAP Task Force of the OECD/EPOC that has a great experience on relevant issues in the EECCA countries (Eastern Europe, Caucasus and Central Asia). The Egypt Country Dialogue is also an important contribution of YPEHODE in the realization of the commitments arising from the Protocol signed during the 6th Joint Inter-ministerial Committee on Economic and Technical Co-operation, between Greece and Egypt (Cairo, 18-19 June 2006).

YPEHODE supports and finances the MED EUWI Initiative, through state budget, with a core annual fund reaching approximately 0.10 MEURO to cover administrative-horizontal activities. In 2006, a co-funding by the EU Commission (DG AidCo) was activated to financially support selected MED EUWI activities, for two years (2006-2008), with the amount of approximately 1,07 MEURO. Key contributors in the process include, the GEF, UNEP, UCC, Development Banks, bilateral EU ODA.

Ministry of National Education and Religious Affairs

Establishment of a Seed-potato Center and a Farmers' Co-operative in the Tsalka region - Georgia


Features of the Tsalka region in Georgia:

- Remote, poor access infrastructures, high transportation costs;
- High altitude (approximately 1.500 meters);
- A distance of about 80 kilometers south-western of T'bilisi;
- Rapid rate of population deserting from the villages;

- Main activities: livestock farming and potato production;
- Very low incomes, widespread poverty.

Rationale for the planning of the program:

- to increase incomes and provide employment,
- to ensure sustainability of the development impact,
- to make full usage of the region's natural and human resources, and
- to exploit the comparative advantages of the area (if any) and to turn them into competitive advantages.



The isolation of the area and the experience of the local farmers in producing potatoes generated the idea of directing the area towards seed-potato production, guaranteed for its quality. The isolation of the area and the high altitude are advantages for seed-potato production because the crops are protected from plant diseases that can be highly damaging. However, seed-potato production is a specialised and demanding production, requiring scientific expertise and diligence in the production process but compensating those involved by means of highly priced product.

The project in question concerns the entire chain of seed-potato production (from laboratory up to the market).

Basic actions of the technical part of the project are:

- a) The donation of the necessary equipment, the renovation of laboratory installations and the supply of know-how to the I.M. Lomouri Scientific Research Institute of Farming at Tserovani (near T'bilisi) in order to produce mini-tubers by means of meristematic propagation (the first stages in the production of healthy seed-potato material),
- b) The organization and the training of farmers in order to produce healthy seed-potatoes and
- c) The donation by the Greek project of modern equipment for the establishment of a seed-potato certification laboratory in Tsalka, in order to monitor and certify the quality of seed-potatoes.



From its very beginning the project took into account that production parameters alone are not sufficient for achieving development. The disposal-of-the-products side is also part of the

project. Producers of seed-potatoes have been assisted to form and run five co-operatives following the international principles and practices, with the aim of handling production and marketing of seed-potatoes (and potentially of market-potatoes), for achieving lower costs of production and better prices of their products in the market.

The long process (three years) of deriving Certified seed-potatoes through the laboratory procedure, necessitated an interim step in order to test seed-potato varieties, to get the farmers accustomed to the appropriate and delicate production processes, to guide them in group action etc. So, the project was extended to include the importation of "Elite" seed-potatoes from abroad in 2007, in order to be planted by producers for producing "Certified" seed. This "Certified" seed, after being tested for viruses and other diseases at the Tsalka Laboratory will be ready to be used by market-potato producers. Sixty tons of imported "Elite" seed-potatoes have been donated by the project to Tsalka producers.

Due to the program success, further support has been granted by HELLENIC AID for ensuring its sustainability, especially with reference to the post-harvest handling of seed-potatoes and the marketing of both seed-potatoes and market-potatoes by farmers' co-operatives. This new extension of the project has as its basic components:

- the installation of a grading and packing line for seed-potatoes and potentially for market potatoes
- the training of the Tsalka Laboratory personnel,
- the formation of new co-operatives by the recipients of certified seed-potatoes donated by the founders of the first co-operatives,
- the formation of a Union of the farmers' co-operatives for strengthening their bargaining power,
- the formation of an NGO which will be authorised by the government to issue official certifications for the quality of seed-potatoes,
- the elaboration of a contract between the Union of Farmers' Co-operatives and the Tserovani Institute for the production of mini-tubers by laboratory and green house processes.

It is expected that by so doing:

- the incomes of the participating farmers will be increased substantially,
- the region will be revitalised,
- the country will benefit from using certified seed-potatoes of high productivity,
- foreign currency will be saved by substituting domestic production of seed-potatoes for imports and
- will increase the self respect of the population.

The importance of the contribution of the project can be appreciated by pointing out that the use of certified seed-potatoes gives yields of the order of 40 tons per hectare, when the use of local seed-potatoes reduces yields down to around 10-15 tons.

The project was financed by HELLENIC AID through the Ministry of National Education and Religious Affairs, while it was implemented by the Horticulture Laboratory of the Agricultural University of Athens.

Ministry of Health and Social Solidarity

Training of health care personnel for the treatment of AIDS - South Africa

This activity was implemented by the National School of Public Health with the rationale that AIDS is a very important problem in South Africa, where it is estimated that 12% of the population suffers from the disease or is a carrier of the HIV virus. Therefore, training of

health care personnel for the treatment of AIDS, in co-operation with local Authorities, contributes to combating the problem.

The implemented activities included:

a) compilation of training material on the following issues:

- planning and implementation of an epidemiological research on HIV/AIDS,
- design and implementation of a register and surveillance system for HIV/AIDS,
- global epidemiological data, tendencies of the epidemics, regions of high risk in relation to the ways of transmittance and the sub-types of HIV,
- methodology for laboratory diagnosis and methods of approaching the population,
- methodology for disclosing information to HIV negative persons before and after their examination,
- methodology for disclosing information to HIV positive persons and the members of their families,
- medical supervision and methodology for psychological support of HIV positive persons.



b) development of information material:

- procedures for informing the general public, women and children,
- design of information brochures and posters for the above mentioned groups.

c) training of trainers:

- training of ten officers nominated by the Ministry of Health of South Africa for ten days on the aforesaid issues.

d) pilot training carried out by the trainers:

- the scientific team monitored the pilot implementation of the activity, an evaluation followed and necessary modifications on the training procedure followed.

e) work meeting in South Africa to finalise the form of the information material that was reproduced and distributed by the Ministry of Health of the recipient country. Special emphasis was given to provision of information to school children.

Ministry of Rural Development and Food

Food Safety and Hygiene – Plant Protection - Georgia

The program, in the form of training seminar, on “Food Safety and Hygiene – Plant Protection” was implemented from 28 November to 5 December 2006 and was attended by eleven experts of the Ministry of Agriculture of Georgia. It included the following thematic units:

- E.U Legislation for hygiene (Regulations 852/2004, 853/2004, 854/2004, 888/2004).
- Planning and implementation of measures of state control, monitoring of food & feed producers and distributors. Shelf check procedures, ranking of potential hazards.
- Organizing national plant protection programs (monitoring, organizing the personnel etc) in the country (case study of *Bactrocera oleae* in olive tree).
- Visit of the ISO certified CIHEAM laboratories: a) Analytical Chemistry (detection of agrochemical residues), b) Soil and Leaf Tissue Analysis, c) Genetically-Modified Organisms.

- Organizing plant protection in case of emergency situations (locusts, rat infestations in crops).
- Critical uses of plant protection products (case study of methyl bromide in undercover crop protection and fenthion in olive tree).
- Plant protection products registration system in Greece. Registration procedures and the list of registered pesticides.



- Existing control system of residues agrochemical and pesticides in the plant products. Certification system of agricultural products.
- Planning and implementation of measures of state control, monitoring of plant protection products.

Ministry of Mercantile Marine

Vocational training – training in the Academies of Mercantile Marine (AEN)

The Ministry of Mercantile Marine participated in the Development Co-operation and Assistance Program for developing countries for the year 2006, through the provision of free of charge, apprenticeship, food and accommodation to foreign students in the Academies of Mercantile Marine of Greece. In particular, during the referred year, eighteen (18) foreign students in total studied in the Schools of Macedonia, Crete, Inousses, Kymi, Ionian Islands and Syros, coming from:

- Syria (11),
- Jordan (3),
- Libya (3) and
- the Palestinian Authority (1).



According to Greek Legislation, admission of foreign students is acceptable provided that there is a relevant Bilateral Agreement and/or a Protocol for Cultural Co-operation with the country of origin of the interested persons and/or the nomination for selection of the interested persons is officially proposed by the respective Diplomatic Authority and provided that the interested persons adhere to the following conditions:

- are up to 25 years old,
- have knowledge of the Greek language and
- have been deemed to be physically and mentally competent, by a Competent Greek Health Committee, according to the applicable provisions for each qualification (Captain – Engineer).

Regarding the aforesaid, those interested submit supporting documents issued by the Competent Authorities, Domestic or Foreign. After the collection of the supporting documents and the determination of the number of foreign candidates, a Common Ministerial Decree (KYA) signed by the Ministry of Mercantile Marine and the Ministry of Foreign Affairs is issued, for the determination of the number, by nationality, of foreign students who will be admitted during the Academic year. Another YEN Decree follows, that allocates foreign students in each School (Academy of Mercantile Marine), depending on the candidate's specialty (Captain – Engineer).

Ministry of Tourism

Establishment of the Georgian – Greek School of Tourism “Ikaros” - Georgia

Co-operation in the tourism sector officially started when an Agreement on Co-operation in the field of Tourism was signed in 1997, between the Government of the Hellenic Republic and the Government of Georgia. The Agreement provides, inter alia, for all possible forms of co-operation in the field of vocational training of personnel employed in the tourist sector.

In October 2004 during the 2nd Session of the Joint Intergovernmental Commission for Economic and Technological Co-operation between Greece and Georgia in T'bilisi, the Georgian side underlined the complete lack of a tourism vocational training School in the country and requested the assistance of the Greek Ministry of Tourism for the establishment of such a School.

During the following period a lot of discussions were held between the Greek Ministry of Tourism and the Georgian Tourism Authority as well as the Georgian private tourism sector (hoteliers, tour operators etc). The main results of the discussions were that Georgia needed a School, which would cover the field of vocational tourism training, supply the tourism sector with specialized skilled professional staff, and fill the gap between school education and university level tourism studies.

In April 2006, the Greek Ministry of Tourism provided the Georgian side with the basic equipment (electrical and electronic equipment, office furniture, training restaurant furniture etc.) for the operation of the School during its first years of operation.

In June 2006, the Action Plan for the establishment and operation of the School was elaborated by the Greek Ministry of Tourism and delivered to the Georgian side.

From 5 to 19 of October 2006, the Greek Ministry of Tourism organized, in Athens, a “Pedagogical and tourism training program” for 12 trainers of the newly established School



The next steps for the support of the School will be:

- participation of the five best - second year - students of the School, each summer and for three months, in on the job training programs, in selective 5 or 4 star hotels. The students

will be fully accommodated and will get a sum allowance, as pocket money, of approximately 250 EURO per month.

- provision of supplementary equipment (professional electrical equipment and electronic equipment).
- invitation, in November 2007, of the Director and 2-3 trainers of the School, to stay in a Greek Tourism School and get familiar with the functioning and the running of its training programs.
- organization of a practical training program for 2-3 trainers of the School, in their tutoring field, in selective 5 or 4 star hotels.
- participation, in the Supervisory Board of the School, of a representative of the Greek Ministry of Tourism in order to safeguard the continuation of assistance.

In November 2006 the first official State vocational Tourism School was founded in T'bilisi and will start operating, with 165 students, in September 2007. With the target to acquire "A strong position in the Tourism Market" it will provide the private tourism sector with specialists in catering, culinary arts and hotel operations and will offer :

- Diplomas, in the field of catering, culinary arts and hotel operations, after two years of attendance, including six months of practical training, for graduates of at least the basic school (age 15 and over).
- Certificates for Cooks, Barmen, Waiters, Hotel Operation and Hotel reservation staff, after four months attendance in re-training courses for graduates of secondary or post secondary school (age 18 and over).

Hellenic Organization for Small and Medium Industries and Handicraft (EOMMEH)

Provision of Technical Assistance by EOMMEH for the benefit of the food and beverages sector of the BSEC Member-States via organizing a Scientific Workshop on food and beverages hygiene and security management systems as well as for business contacts among the participants

EOMMEH in co-operation with the Permanent Secretariat of the Black Sea Economic Co-operation Organization (BSEC) took the initiative and brought for the first time in direct contact representatives of the private sector of the food and beverages field from BSEC Member-States, a field of particular importance for all economies of these countries, through the organization of a Workshop on the abovementioned theme.

Thessaloniki was consciously chosen to be the meeting place, during the parallel holding in this city of two very important events of products promotion from the food and beverages sector, such as the international exhibitions "DETROP" and "OENOS".



Two representatives from the private sector – businessmen of the food and beverages field from each BSEC Member State, as well as the Deputy Secretary-General of BSEC, were invited and participated at the Workshop.

Through this initiative the achievement of the following goals was sought:

- contribution to the establishment of business contacts – acquaintance and promotion of co-operation between representatives of the specific sector of BSEC member states,
- provision of information on the modern food and beverages certification and standardization methods through the organization of a special workshop on the topic,
- exchange of experience among participants,
- potential visiting of the international exhibitions “DETROP” and “OENOS”,
- potential undertaking of various business co-operations and contacts among the Workshop’s participants.

Manpower Employment Organization (OAED)

Development and implementation of an integrated vocational training system - Albania

In the framework of enhancing co-operation, in the sectors of vocational training and employment, between the National Employment Service of Albania (NES) and OAED, the two sides agreed on implementing training projects and provide respective equipment. The projects in question target poverty elimination by raising living standards and by substantially improving local development potentials, via enhancing vocational training and triggering employment, especially among the young and women.

In particular, activities of the abovementioned program included:

- **TRAINING OF TRAINERS** – duration 100 hours – The program covered training of fifteen trainers from Albania in a Greek city near the borders and in particular in Kastoria. It aimed to provide training knowledge and skills that will allow them to work as vocational training trainers.
- **TRAINING OF UNEMPLOYED ALBANIANS** – duration 400 hours – The program covered training of fifteen unemployed Albanians, secondary education graduates, specializing in “Hotel Employees having P/C knowledge” in a boarder city of Albania and in particular, in Korce.

The candidates were selected according to regulations and criteria set by the signed Agreement. In this regard, participants were unemployed persons, job seekers, registered in the Regional Employment Office of Korce, 18–25 years old, graduates of secondary education schools and 60% women.

Six trainers were used for the training sessions, five of whom were trained during the first stage of the program in Kastoria. Since the initial stages of training, very good co-operation was developed with the Korce University of Economics, which provided a significant part of the required training materials. Actual training of the unemployed on the Hotel sector attracted attention and interest of the local media, which covered the initiation of the co-operation in Korce, that was attended by the heads of the two National Employment Services of Greece and Albania (OAED and NES).

- **PROVISION OF SPECIAL P/C EQUIPMENT** – Special equipment was provided and also material and special software were developed, the type, form and content of which were based on combined assessments (sought goals, trainers’ features) and operated complementarily to the training program.

Main goals of the program:

- raising potential of vocational training in public and private centers in Albania,
- qualitative upgrading and enhancement of training projects according to the circumstances of the working environment and more effective correlation between training of the unemployed and opportunities for prompt employment in the labor market of Albania,

- improving capabilities of unemployed Albanians and in particular of the young, to promptly and effectively adjust to the needs of the labor market,
- integrating new technologies as tools and content of the training projects.

Beneficiary population groups.

The program was addressed to unemployed graduates of secondary education, who live in regions of Albania with high unemployment rates and severe social problems. More analytically, the program focused at unemployed Albanians, low-skilled or having a low level of specialization and thus low absorbance in the labor market, emphasizing on the recently unemployed and women.

Indirect beneficiaries included, all vocational education and training stakeholders of Albania, training institutions in Albania (Vocational Training Centers [KEK] – Public – Private), the National Employment Service (NES) of Albania, the Regional Employment Directorates, the professions and the sectors tending to constitute in future the priorities of the country's economic development.

B-1.3 Development education

Development Education Programs

The term “development education” covers internationally, all those activities involving public awareness on issues concerning the developing world.

The European development NGOs, characterize with this term a set of training activities addressed to social partners, students, young people and to the broader public, aiming at raising awareness and providing information on issues bringing forward North - South relations and the promotion of volunteerism, both in donor and in recipient countries.

Within the framework of the Greek international development co-operation policy, YDAS-4 Directorate of HELLENIC AID, undertook the following activities during 2006, regarding mobilization of civil society, awareness raising and promotion of volunteerism:


- Participation in the global fundraising and awareness event “Fight Hunger: Walk the World 2006”, a UN World Food Program (WFP) initiative, which took place, in May 21st 2006, in Athens, among many other cities of the world with one sole purpose, to call for an end to child hunger.



- Production, in Greek, of the educational humanitarian videogame Food Force, a UN World Food Program (WFP) initiative, on the eradication of hunger in the developing world, for distribution in the schools of Greece.



- Coordination of the national procedure (assessment of the Greek entries, selection of the national winner) of the “Development Youth Prize 2006: Focus on Africa”, an artwork contest (photo, poster or a multimedia presentation), organized by the European Schoolnet (EUN), open to pupils of the 25 member states of the European Union, aimed at promoting international development co-operation in Africa.



- Participation in the European Development Days Conference, which was held in Brussels, in November 2006. The aim of this European Commission initiative was to enhance public awareness about development co-operation and strengthen effectiveness of the European Union's development assistance, especially to Africa.



- Coordination in the setting up of a HELLENIC AID stand at the special display area of the Thessaloniki International Fair.



- Production of an educational series on the projects and activities undertaken by HELLENIC AID in various geographical regions of the globe, televised by the Hellenic Broadcasting Corporation (ERT S.A.), during the winter of 2006.




- Co-financing of the “1st European Song Festival of New Artists and Disabled Artists-ALL TOGETHER”, organized by the European Forum of Volunteer Organizations, on the World Volunteer Day, December, 5th, 2006.



- Co-financing of the photography exhibition “KLIK to Volunteerism”, organized by the “Citizen in Deed” Organization on Volunteerism on the World Volunteer Day, December, 5th, 2006, at the showroom of the Syntagma metro station.



- Publication of the HELLENIC AID 2006 Album, which contains a brief presentation of the main humanitarian, development and development education projects and activities, relevant visual material and statistical data on humanitarian and development bilateral assistance.



- Publication of a new updated information brochure refereeing to the organization, the policy and the programs implemented by HELLENIC AID, which addresses the general public. This brochure is a practical handbook, that includes a summary presentation of the Service's work for the past two years, as well as analytical information on the registration requirements for NGO registration at the Special NGOs Registry of HELLENIC AID.

"Traveling and educating a fair and jointly liable world", Development education project on Fair Trade

Information and awareness raising of the public on the principles of fair trade, adoption of a responsible consumer behavior and promotion of the fair trade products, which derive from poor communities of the developing world and are produced according to the sustainable development standards of the countries of origin.

Direct beneficiaries from the project are youths of the whole country, students of primary and secondary education as well as the general public. Indirect beneficiaries are the local populations of the developing countries, where the fair trade products come from.

A four-member delegation was recruited for the accomplishment of the aforementioned goal. The members of the delegation, using a vehicle especially designed to meet the needs of the project, having the approval of local authorities, visited four towns in the country (Thessaloniki, Patra, Larissa, Komotini) and six municipalities of the Attica region.

In every stop of the vehicle, the delegation presented the related educational material (videos, brochures, workshop-games, debate-games) in schools, squares, festivals and university campuses. Local students, youths and the public had the opportunity to gather information on fair trade principles and products, as well as participate in interactive activities.

It is estimated that, by the completion of the project (January, 31st 2008) the number of the direct beneficiaries will rise to 36,000 people, of which 5,000 youths.

The program was implemented by the NGO "Fair Trade Hellas".

Note: The text of sub-chapter [B-1] was drawn up in collaboration with various Bodies (Ministries and Legal Entities) by sector of competence.

B-2 Geographical Distribution of Aid

B-2.1 Policies and initiatives on geographic allocation of aid among Recipients and categories of countries

All projects and programs of international development co-operation are part of Greek development diplomacy and an important section of Greek foreign policy.

In the framework of the strategic planning of development co-operation for the year 2006, a process that sought to enhance effectiveness of aid management, Greece focused at a limited number of recipient countries (countries – targets), in order to achieve higher degree of efficiency of its financing initiatives.

Greece has planned the geographical distribution of its bilateral ODA for 2006 upon certain priorities, aiming at making a substantial impact in the fight against the multiple problems faced by societies of developing countries partners.

Greece follows the internationally acceptable development strategies in granting development assistance. A prerequisite for selecting a country to become an aid recipient is its expressed will to develop, within the internationally acceptable framework of development strategy. Namely, to prioritize poverty reduction, enhance democratic institutions, human rights, good governance and environmental sustainability.


The country strategy approach and in parallel the holistic process followed, provides Greece the capability of making annual budget allocations of funds to priority countries and main sectors and then determine accordingly, which implementing Ministries, legal Bodies and NGOs, are the best suited to contribute to the set goals.

Gradually, a higher portion of aid granted is channeled to LLDCs in Asia and Africa. This constitutes a commitment of the international community and of course of Greece. In this respect, the Greek strategic framework in its main policy orientations provides for new initiatives in favor of LLCDs, among which is the annual increase of ODA granted.

B-2.2

Priority or aid concentration countries


During the planning process of the geographical distribution of aid for the year 2006, HELLENIC AID took into consideration the Poverty Reduction Strategy Papers (PRSPs) which provide the appropriate framework for planning geographical strategy, since they combine developing countries' development needs with the corresponding capabilities and comparative advantages of donors. In this respect Greece selected the following countries – targets for 2006:



- **AFRICA**
Angola, Egypt, Ethiopia, Ivory Coast, Ghana, Eritrea, Zambia, Zimbabwe, Cameroon, Kenya, Congo Democratic Republic, Malawi, Mali, Benin, Burkina Faso, Botswana, Niger, South Africa, Sudan, Togo.
- **ASIA – SOUTH & CENTRAL ASIA**












Bilateral ODA granted to **Asian** countries presents an augmented trend throughout the years, as it is shown at the following GRAPH.







Bilateral ODA granted to countries of the **Middle East** presents an augmented trend throughout the years, as it is shown at the following GRAPH.











B-3 Sectoral Distribution of Aid

Greek development co-operation priority sectors are selected in the framework of the “Millennium Development Goals” (MDGs), as follows:

- Infrastructure programs in the sectors of primary and secondary education and vocational training, especially for job creation.
- Infrastructure programs in the sector of health, small medical centers - mainly for children and women, who are the most underprivileged groups of the population in LLDCs.
- Programs in the sector of water supply, drinkable water, small dams, reconstruction of houses, as well as basic social infrastructures for villages and small towns.
- Environmental protection and agricultural development programs, repairing of agricultural equipment, new crops, job creation and income generation programs.
- Programs that establish and promote institutions, support democratization and strengthen the young and women, to enable them having access on equal terms to basic education, training, health, financing etc.

The basic strategic goal of Greece is poverty reduction and the achievement of the MDGs via implementing development assistance programs and projects in specific sectors. It is in these sectors that Greek aid was focused during 2006 in the form of grants.

Sectoral distribution of Greek Official Development Assistance (ODA) granted in 2006 is aggregately presented in TABLE [4] & GRAPH [D].

An analytical overview follows, presenting the basic statistical data of the year 2006 by:

- **sector of aid** (see also TABLE [4] for aggregate data on developing countries presented in ANNEX [III]) and
- **kind of aid** (see also TABLE [3] & GRAPH [C] for aggregate data on developing countries presented in ANNEX [III]).

Multilateral Development Assistance Program

The number of International Organizations and their impact on the international system is constantly increasing. Their role becomes increasingly more essential, while their competences expand. This process is due on the one hand, to globalized problems that can no longer be resolved by each single state and on the other, to globalized opportunities for co-operation in all fields of human activity.

Achieving the MDGs has recently gained priority in the strategic planning of International Organizations. The effort was initiated by the UN who plays a leading role, while others like the World Bank and the E.U, together with most of their Member States, have actively been mobilized.

Greece participates in numerous economic-financial, social and developmental International Organizations, whose objectives promote the same development goals that Greece pursues. Namely, poverty reduction and achievement of the MDGs, human capital development, sustainable development, effective response to emergency humanitarian crises, protection of the environment and others. Activities implemented by the above International Organizations, in combination and coordination with bilateral official development assistance provided by Greece, contribute substantially and in a complementary manner, to the achievement of globally recognized development.

Being a founding member of the main International Development Organizations and of Regional Development Banks, Greece considers their work very important and subscribes fully, both to their core budgets, as well as to Trust Funds established on an "ad hoc" basis, to finance specific sectoral needs.

Greek multilateral aid is granted through three sources, namely:

- The European Union,
- The United Nations and
- International Financing Organizations including the World Bank


Various Ministries, in accordance to their purpose and competences that stem from International Conventions, provide funds through International Organisations, to meet international development objectives. Before proceeding to the provision of multilateral aid, Greece participates in international preparatory conferences, organized by International Organizations and coordinates its policy according to the decisions taken there.

Therefore, Greece is constantly informed on international developments and is prepared to contribute in a positive manner. Furthermore, in cases of regional initiatives, Greece proceeds to bilateral contacts with the interested parties, in order to achieve the best possible outcomes.

Greek multilateral ODA subscriptions to International Organizations for the year 2006 amounted to 234.78 MUSD or 187.04 MEURO (0.10% of GNI). This amount constitutes approximately 55% of the overall ODA (bilateral and multilateral) granted. Out of the total subscriptions of Greece, the amount of 201.95 MUSD was encashed to International Organizations, while the balance, some 32.83 MUSD was deposited with International

Organizations in the form of “Documents of Unqualified Commitment” for future payment, as analytically referred hereunder.

United Nations Industrial Development Organization

The United Nations Industrial Development Organization aims at the provision of assistance to developing countries and to countries with economies in transition, in order to accelerate their development with simultaneous response to their social and environmental needs. The subscription of Greece to UNIDO in 2006 amounted to 0.60 MEURO.

United Nations Development Program

The United Nations Development Program (UNDP) focuses on activities for the developing countries. The objective of the UNDP is poverty reduction at the global level, mainly through the implementation of "Country Development Programs" that cover a wide range of activities in developing countries. Greece's subscription to the UNDP in 2006 reached 0.29 MEURO.

Black Sea Trade and Investment Promotion Program

In the framework of the United Nations Development Program, an Agreement on the implementation of the "Black Sea Trade and Investment Promotion Program" was concluded between the Ministry of Economy and Finance and the UNDP. This "Program", having a three year duration (2007-2010), aims at extending intra-regional links of trade and investment, through the determination of unexploited potential of investment and trade in Albania, Armenia, Azerbaijan, Bulgaria, Georgia, Moldova, Romania, Russia, Serbia, Turkey and Ukraine. The "Program" anticipates for the establishment of a UNDP office in Athens for implementing its activities. In 2006, the Ministry of Economy and Finance financed the Program with a lump sum contribution of 0.50 MEURO, for the period 2007-2010.

B-4.3 World Bank (W.B)



In 2006, total subscriptions amounted to 33.82 MEURO or 42.45 MUSD, approximately 18% on total multilateral ODA.

International Development Association (IDA)

IDA is one of the most significant sources of assistance provision for the 82 poorer countries of the world, 39 of which are located in Africa. Greece is a member of IDA since 1962. Its quota in the subscribed capital is 0.12% and its votes 0.25% (35.502). Contributions of donor countries cover over 50% of the fourteenth replenishment of the Organization's resources (IDA-14), amounting to 33 BUSD.

The subscription of Greece to IDA-14, for the period 1/7/2005-30/6/2008, amounts to 20.60 MUSD. Particularly, in 2006 the subscription of Greece reached 1.13 MEURO for IDA-14 and 4.07 MEURO for IDA-13. Greece intends to progressively increase its subscription to IDA, beginning from the fifteenth replenishment of the Organization's resources (IDA-15).

It is worth noting that on 27-2-2006, the Ministry of Economy and Finance submitted three "Unqualified Commitment Documents" bearing the amounts of 6,866,667 EURO, of 6,866,667 EURO and of 6,866,666 EURO, payable on 27-2-2006, 16-1-2007 and 15-1-2008 respectively, for the payment of Greece's subscription to the 14th replenishment of IDA resources.

Initiative for the Relief of the Highly Indebted Poor Countries.

Multilateral and bilateral creditors, as well as commercial creditors, participate in this Initiative. In the framework of the 14th replenishment of IDA resources, Greece will pay to the HIPC Trust Fund, during the period 2006-2008, the amount of 1.82 MEURO in three equal installments.

Multilateral Debt Relief Initiative

The Multilateral Debt Relief Initiative (MDRI) aims at writing-off total (100%) debt owed, by the Highly Indebted Poor Countries (HIPCs) that reach the "Completion Point", to IDA, the African Development Fund (AfDF) and to the International Monetary Fund (IMF).

The total cost of the MDRI Initiative for the 42 eligible countries is estimated to reach approximately 37 BUSD (or 24.8 BSDR). The total estimated amount of Greece's subscription to IDA for financing the MDRI, based on its agreed share of 0,13%, will amount to 37.69 MEURO (or 31,7 MSDR) for the period 2007-2044.

It is noted that, in 4-9-2006, an "Unqualified Commitment Document" was submitted to IDA to cover the financing of the Multilateral Debt Relief Initiative (MDRI). The total amount of Greece's subscription will reach 37.69 MEURO for the period 2007-2044. This amount will be paid as follows: 830,000 EURO for the years 2007-2008 with Unqualified Commitment, 7,180,000 EURO for the years 2009-2016 with Unqualified Commitment and 29,680,000 EURO for the years 2017-2044 with Qualified Commitment, subject to legislative regulation if required. Greece will pay its subscriptions annually, based on a Payment Schedule.

Replenishment of the Global Environment Facility resources

The Global Environment Facility (GEF) was established in 1991, as a pilot program, within the framework of the United Nations International Conventions on the Environment, aiming at confronting global or regional environmental problems and supporting at the same time national activities regarding Sustainable Development.

The subscription of Greece for the third replenishment of GEF resources (1/7/2002-30/6/2006) amounted to 1.43 MEURO, which was paid in 2006 and corresponds to the fourth and last installment. Moreover, within 2006 Greece paid the first installment of its subscription to the fourth replenishment of the GEF (1/7/2006-30/6/2010) that amounted to 1.43 MEURO as well. It is noted that a Commitment Document was submitted to the GEF on 7-12-2007 for the financing of the 4th replenishment of its resources.
