Bilateral Official Development Assistance Granted by Geographical Region [year 2006]



Percentage allocation of Bilateral Official Development Assistance (ODA) by Sector of Aid [year 2006]











MILLENNIUM DEVELOPMENT GOALS (MDGs)

GOAL 1

ERADICATE EXTREME POVERTY AND HUNGER

TARGET 1

Halve, between 1990 and 2015, the proportion of people whose income is less than one dollar a day

Indicators for monitoring progress:

- Proportion of population below 1 USD (PPP) per day

GOAL 2






